JUNIOR CHAIRPERSON'S REPORT 2021

Like all organisations Covid 19 has also had an impact on the operations of Junior Surf Lifesaving in 2020/21. With the support of SLSNSW, David Field, Sam Clutterbuck, Debbie Pawsey and each club nippers have fortunately continued at a Club and Branch level with minimal changes for the Far North Coast.

The weather has been less kind to the Surf Sports component of the nipper program with the Cabarita Teams Carnival cancelled in December. Nippers competed with their expected enthusiasm at the Lennox Head U12-masters carnival, it was a great show piece for athletes and an opportunity for nippers to be part of the larger social context of surf lifesaving in FNC. Thank you to Lennox Head Surf Club for organising a great day. Yamba bravely navigated the first and only nipper carnival so far this season. They must be congratulated for their organisation and coordination creating a competitive and fair carnival within our new COVID safe environment. Nippers across all clubs are now in preparation for the Branch Championships, Cabarita Branch Carnival and NSW All Age Championships. I would like to acknowledge the considerable administrative and logistical workload it has taken to organise surf sports this year and thank all those involved in making these events happen.

Age Managers and Junior Activity Coordinators (JAC) were given the opportunity to upskill with a presentation at Salt Surf Club from Doug Hawkins. Doug presented the JAC Training Course and the Age Managers Course. A significant theme across the JAC presentation was the challenge of engagement and retention of both nippers and parents. Clubs were encouraged to think creatively on how to engage parents in Sunday Nippers and clubs have responded implementing various training for parents such as SRC and beach observer training. The Age Managers were encouraged to consider changing the structure of the Sunday Nipper program – in essence less racing and more education was discussed. It was evident that clubs have different expectations on what an Age Manager can achieve and the surf guides are instrumental in ensuring the learning outcomes for each group were achieved as a priority.

The Junior Lifesaver of the Year is always a highlight for the U14 age group. Thank you to Sam Clutterbuck for his patience in organising the panel and interviews not once but twice due to the weather conditions. The panel comprised of John Watson (FNC), Paul Smith and Mikala Campbell interviewed the U14 candidates from the junior clubs across Far North Coast Branch. Choosing a candidate to represent Far North Coast is always a challenge, congratulations to all those U14s that participated in this program allowing individuals to demonstrate and develop their understanding of the values and purpose of surf lifesaving. Phoebe Link (Byron Bay) and Ethan Bayly (Lennox Head) were successful at the FNC interviews and will travel to Sydney in April to attend the Development Camp. I wish them all the best with this opportunity.

After considering the feedback from previous U13/14 development camps, David Field was instrumental in orchestrating a camp with a difference, Dare to Lead in Lifesaving. The seventy two 13 and 14 year old's were able to engage in a variety of activities and information sessions to enhance their understanding and skills in search and rescue, drone flying and leadership. The program was well structured over 24 hours and the group were given plenty of opportunity to socialise with other clubs and get to know other future lifesavers. David organised an impressive line of speakers from politicians to IRB drivers who motivated the nippers to continue to engage in the surf lifesaving community. The parent chaperones were able to learn some things to and meet other parents. Thank you to Salt Surf Club who graciously hosted the camp and cooked up a delicious bacon and egg roll on Sunday morning. From yoga to night searches most areas of surf lifesaving were touched on, David really did cover of everything. Thank you, David Field, for the time you invested in programming and presenting, also Sam Clutterbuck for his administration in the background.

Finally, congratulations to all Far North Coast nippers and their families for beginning or continuing your journey in the lifesaving movement in 2020/21. I know your nipper will value the surf safe award they achieve this year, hopefully it will be the first of many and they continue on to achieve their Bronze Medallion. The lifesaving community provides ongoing opportunity for learning and engagement, and in my experience is a great example of an organisation where you get out of something what you give. If you haven't quite found you place in your club, keep searching there really is something for everyone. I look forward to seeing some of the nippers in action over the next few weeks at Branch Championships in Cudgen and at the Cabarita Carnival. Thank you to Far North Coast Branch and in particular, Sam Clutterbuck who really has kept the JACs on track as we navigate an unusual season.

Feedback has been overwhelmingly positive and the JACs should take a bow for the way they facilitated the Camp.

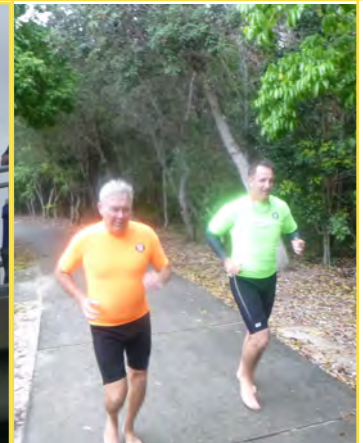

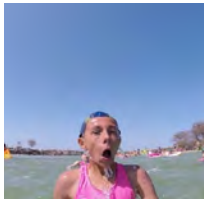

BRUNSWICK SLSC JUNIORS

The 2020/21 season has been very encouraging for Brunswick Nippers. With the redevelopment of the Clubhouse expected to commence in November / December 2020 the Committee elected not to actively recruit for the season and to have a year of consolidation. Nevertheless, we had an unexpected increase in numbers over last year – up to over 160 – which is great but has presented its challenges. By far our greatest numbers are in the U6 to U8 age groups, and we have really been fostering parent and carer involvement this year to build our water safety and official stocks for upcoming seasons. We anticipate that once the Clubhouse redevelopment is complete, our numbers will significantly increase, and the Committee will be developing strategic and forward financial plans to cater for this potential growth.

There has been a great atmosphere at our regular Nippers Sunday Sessions, and the enthusiasm of the kids as well as their parents and carers is very heartening. It was pleasing to work together rather than just compete against one another.

On the matter of working together, this season we were also grateful to be able to host a special Junior Search and Rescue Training Day coordinated by David Field and attended by Brunswick and Byron U13 and U14 Nippers. The training covered various theoretical and practical lessons and the kids received valuable guidance and instruction in this element of Surf Lifesaving. A big thank you to David for coordinating this day, and to the Byron contingent for their participation and assistance.

I'd also like to thank David, Sam and Kirsty for coordinating the recent Junior Development Camp - it was a lot time and effort over a short period of time, and it is appreciated. Thanks also to the support crew (Water Safety and Chaperones), the presenters, and to Salt SLSC for hosting the event.

Our first Sunday morning session of the New Year was held on 17 January, with by far the best conditions of the season. Again, we had encouraging numbers and we are refreshed and ready for the charge to the end of the season.

We are excited about the future of Brunswick SLSC and Nippers, and the opportunities that will come with a new state-of-the-art Club House. I don't know that we will ever match it with our powerhouse neighbours, but Brunswick SLSC has a bright future for many years to come.

BYRON BAY SLSC JUNIORS

Byron Bay Junior Surf Life Saving Club started the season in October 2020 with 250 nippers. Nearly half of the Byron Bay nippers were new this year and it has been wonderful to share our lifesaving culture with more families from around Australia and the globe. Byron Bay Main Beach experienced significant erosion in 2020 impacting on the safety of the beach for the community and many beach days over the middle and latter part of the year saw the beach closed due to the hazards. Submerged rocks, debris and limited sand all impacting on nipper activities. With support from the surf club executive and patrols nippers completed the program by making use of the clubhouse, park, pool and Captain Cook's Beach. Thank you for the support from other Nipper Clubs offering to assist with training and nipper days.

Thanks to the Doug Hawkins Travelling Roadshow the knowledge and skills of our new and experienced Age Managers was enhanced with a day at Salt SLSC in September. This session motivated the club to offer a group of nipper parents training in SRC which was completed in November. Further education is intended for parents with previous Bronze Medallion qualification who need intensive proficiency. The engagement of parents in our nipper program is essential to enable the Byron Bay Nipper community to meet the demand of nipper registration numbers. The Club is mindful that qualification for nipper parents is needed in water safety, officials, IRB drivers as well as encouraging volunteering in general roles.

Nine nippers from the U14 age group participated in the Byron Bay Junior Lifesaver of the Year. Thank you to Murray Saul and Ann McCabe whom generously contributed their time to this program and were incredibly impressed with the clear perspective the nippers had on the values and purpose of surf lifesaving. Ann and Murray indicated that this group of interviewees were focused on being themselves, participating and engaging in club activities. Thank you to Michael Berti, Age Manager whom has played a crucial role in developing the confidence of the U14s in and out of the water. It is a true testament to Michael to see so many of this group participating in patrols regularly. Congratulations to Phoebe Link and Jack Safranek whom represented the Byron Bay Surf Club at the FNC Junior Lifesaver of the Year. Phoebe Link will now represent Far North Coast in Sydney in April 2021.

Byron Bay Nippers have received support from In the Pink Gelato, Rotary Byron Bay, First Light Healthcare, Byron Bay Farmers Markets and Sun Protection Australia. This support has enabled the purchase of equipment and has subsidised the cost of long sleeve pink rashies as an alternative to the pink singlets improving the sun safety for nippers and Age Managers are now wearing SPF 50 shirts.

The Surf Sports opportunities have been limited this season. Michio McMullen has continued to provide coaching for the water events with the support of other parents. Thank you to Michio for maintaining this program whilst the beach conditions were challenging. A team of eighty participated in the Yamba Carnival and a similar number will participate in the Branch Carnival. A team of ten will travel to the NSW Championships in Swansea Belmont in February.

Thank you to all the Byron Bay Junior Lifesaving community, it has been a year of wonderful teamwork – we began the year with a motto - flexible, fluid and adaptable – this has certainly held us in good stead to negotiate the 2020/21 season.

Whilst maintaining most of our regular committed competitive juniors who love competing at carnivals, we have also been steadily gaining some new recruits, particularly from our younger age groups who we hope will continue to represent our club moving forward. Carnivals are such fun and a great way for club members, young and old, to bond in a special way.

Our Junior Lifesaver of the Year representatives this season are Jaxon Thomas and India Keeling, they are both model nippers on all levels and we are very proud to have them represent our club. Congratulations and good luck!

As always, the season would not run without all the amazing and selfless volunteers who put countless hours into administration, age managing, water safety, BBQ’s, training, raffles, carnivals, COVID marshalling and many more roles to keep our club going. Thank You!

CUDGEN HEADLAND SLSC JUNIORS

Cudgen launched into the 2020/21 season with 277 nippers – a decline on last year attributable to a Winter season with increased shark activity, and a hangover from COVID. Notwithstanding this, we have experienced strong engagement across the season, with excellent numbers on Sundays, and an ongoing strong turnout to training. Consistent with seasons past, our U6 and U7 age groups have attracted large numbers again, reflective of the ongoing growth of the local area. Pleasingly we continue to see new members join our older age groups, with the U8's through to U14's numbers being boosted by new arrivals.

Our approach to Sunday Nippers has changed considerably from last year – Sundays are about building lifesavers of the future. Where we used to go 'round the cans' each weekend, we now focus on skill development, participation and engagement. Our efforts are directed toward ensuring everyone who attends on Sundays participates in all activities and feels like they continue to expand their confidence and skillset in and around the water, along with their knowledge and understanding of beach conditions and lifesaving disciplines. This approach is focused on retention, with our goal to continue retain our numbers through to the older age groups and beyond by providing a fun and educational experience, encouraging children and parents to get involved in club.

Our Cudgen Education team continue to do an amazing job helping with this. The majority of our U14's completed their SRC in September and have been patrolling the beaches during the season. Building on this, our U13 & U14 groups obtained their Junior Search and Rescue Certificate in the first half of the year, joining with Cabarita for a morning of education and fun. Lead by the unstoppable Dave Field, the group conducted land-based training at Salt Park, before a run down the beach, a swim across the creek, and then some practice doing Deep Water entries and water-based searches. Later this season we look forward to having our U12's complete the HLTAID001 "Provide CPR" training course, and our U13's and U14's complete their UAV observers course.

With the increase in shark activity across the Winter, we mandated drone coverage for all Nipper Activity Days and Training sessions. Our drone team, led by Nick Forde, have done an amazing job making this possible. Additionally, with the help of our Education Team, we have 6 Nipper parents qualified to fly the drone for the seasons ahead.

With our large numbers, training days are busy. Our Head Coach, George, has done an epic job challenging our Nippers to a variety of different activities throughout the season. As a result, numbers continue to build, and we regularly have between 30 and 60 kids on Wednesday and Friday afternoons for Board Training, and a core 25 Nippers for Saturday Iron Training. With so many there, ensuring Water Safety coverage is a challenge – but we are continually adding new parents to be part of our water safety team which is great (although we always need more). We have added Ocean Swim training to our schedule and have engaged Phil Clayton to put our Nippers through their paces every third week. Phil's a first class waterman, a great educator and a terrific bloke to have around the club.

The season has started well competitively, with great thanks to Lennox & Yamba for hosting 2 great days of carnivals. Unfortunately due to border restrictions and some event cancellations, we have not had the carnival opportunities of most years in the lead-in to Christmas. However we have entered the new year with enthusiasm, and whilst it is disappointing not to be hosting the Country Championships, we look forward to welcoming all Branch competitors to Cudgen for the FNC Branch Championships at the end of the month. Our efforts will then turn toward State, where we hope to have a good contingent head south.

The Junior Activities Committee greatly appreciates the time and effort put in by the volunteers and sponsors that make our club successful. We all look forward to another fantastic year nurturing the future lifesavers of our community.
